

STOP NET

A 2m drape of eight layered hessian.

Each 2m drape is made by folding 4m of 1.8m wide hessian three times before sealing the short end.

The intention is to make something light and compact which can be used on not-so-busy days (Monday - Wednesday) on the far left of the field.

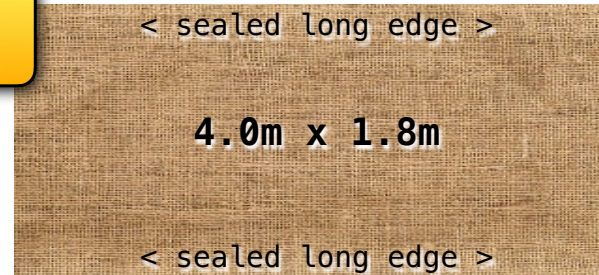
Broken arrows jammed in to metal fixtures, crooks and crannies on the back of the target serve to flair the hessian out from the side of the target.

Finally, each drape is lined with removable layers of black foam.

Eg: Bunnings \$30 1m² x 2cm connectable floor mats cut to 40cm strips. Some scraps left over for reinforcement or repairs.

The light modular symmetry and ease of production (@ \$100 per pair) means that barebow folk, kids and women can easily control the swap or reverse of nets. This allows them to embrace the art of archery without taking up time (or create a hazard) looking for arrows or interrupting other field activities.
